ITEMS COVERED:

- 1. **President's (Glenn) welcome and year in review.** Theft in the neighborhood has led to interest in what steps can be taken to help prevent similar events in the future. With that in mind, the HOA has invited a presentation by Vicki Ruley, Crime Prevention Coordinator with the Walla Walla Police Department.
- 2. Crime prevention report (Vicki Ruley). Among the tips presented:
 - communication is key (neighbors and law enforcement working together)
 - develop a block watch program
 - post block watch signs
 - homeowners sign up at nextdoor.com
 - use the non-emergency dispatch number (527-1960) to report suspicious activity
 - keep windows & doors locked even when at home (and the door between house/garage
 - let neighbors know if you're expecting a package
 - stop newspaper delivery when away from home
 - be vigilant when shopping and carrying bags to car
 - leave outside lights on at night
 - see the "Being Prepared for an Emergency" brochure from the Police Department
 - consider taking the Law Enforcement Citizen's Academy course from the Police Department
- 3. Action item: Block watch signs. Motion to move forward with block watch signs at the Table Rock entrances moved, seconded and passed.
- 4. **Secretary's report.** Motion to approve minutes from the last annual meeting (Jan. 23, 2018), seconded and motion carried.
- 5. Treasurer's report. Lew Krueger estimates HOA expenditures in 2018 will total \$9,369, down from \$10,285 in 2017. Cash in the bank at the end of 2018 is estimated to be around \$6,040, compared to \$5,341 at the end of 2017. Dues for 2018 will stay at \$100/lot. Motion to approve the treasurer's report, seconded and motion carried.

- 6. **Discussion: Possible animal covenant changes.** Idea floated about possibly limiting the number of dogs per household. General consensus that this isn't a covenant issue and is too directive—idea dropped.
- 7. **Discussion: Housing developments in the area.** How will possible development by Hayden Homes affect drainage, water supply, traffic, etc. Documents can be posted on tablerockhoa.org website.
- 8. Action: Move future yearly meetings to November instead of January. Moved, seconded and passed to move future yearly HOA meetings to November.
