Dues lowered to \$75 this year

When nearly everything seems to be costing more and more, the Table Rock HOA board is pleased to announce that dues for 2014 will be \$75, down from \$140 in 2013.

Treasurer Brad Rice reports that the neighborhood expenses in 2013 were less than budgeted, thanks mainly to street light repairs running considerably below their fiveyear average. This left a more-than-adequate cash reserve, allowing the board to lower rates.

The dues cover the cost of street lights, property management, water



for the common area and other neighborhood expenses detailed in the treasurer's report.

The dues, made payable to Table Rock Homeowners Association, are due by January 31, 2014. A \$25 late fee will be added after that date. You can bring dues to the annual meeting or mail to TRHOA, P.O. Box 1871, Walla Walla, WA 99362. §

Coyotes, foxes visit Table Rock

Coyotes and foxes have been spotted in the area. These critters, perhaps Table Rock's wildest neighbors, are looking for the chuck wagon, and they may be checking out your yard.

"Snow brings predators out of the mountains to the lower elevations to search for food," savs Robert Baker, a member of the board for the Table Rock Homeowners Association.

"The important thing is to keep them wild," says Ken Gruver, Wildlife Services assistant state director for Washington, in a Union-Bulletin article. "Don't try to feed them. If you see them, run them off, scream at them. Keep them wild."

The animals rarely pose a threat to people, according to the Animal Humane Society (AHS), but they may target small dogs and cats that are left alone outdoors. Be sure to keep your pets safe so they don't end

up being snacks.

To discourage covotes or foxes, the AHS recommends:

- Do not feed them.
- Keep all dog and cat food inside, especially at night.
- Secure garbage cans with tight fitting lids; preferably keep them in a garage or enclosure so they can't be tipped.
- Keep compost in a fenced area or a large secure container, not open piles.



- Clean up around bird feeders. Covotes will find and eat bird seed on the ground.
- Don't let your pets free roam outdoors. Also watch your pets while outside.

If you see a coyote or fox, make lots of noise and scare it away-don't let them become habituated to people.
